	Short Description	<p>An audience is shown a short play in which a central character (protagonist) encounters an oppression or obstacle which she/he is unable to overcome; the subject-matter will usually be something of immediate importance to the audience, often based on a shared life experience.</p> <p>Results: The link we provide is from a project about inclusion of people from Roma communities and includes the results from its use in their theatrical activities</p> <p>Proposed: A powerful tool for exploring group/team dynamics in the work place or specific issues affecting individuals/groups in schools or other place of learning. Forum theatre can provide a voice for people who normally struggle to be heard. It can also increase the audience's empathy for others. Through the audience participation new ideas and solutions to existing problems can be explored. The theatre setting can be a very powerful tool to explore difficult issues. Provides an entertaining and meaningful way for working with socially excluded groups. Challenges established perceptions. Powerful tool for exploring solutions to difficult problems.
