	Short Description	An assumption/statement is written on the tip of an iceberberg that is drawn up on the board or large flipchart. Learners are asked to explore the rest of the iceberberg in group discussions, e.g. to problematize some aspects of the statement, or to add nuance. During the discussion, learners can start questioning the statement itself. They can put up their ideas on the iceberberg, which can also be visualized, e.g. by drawing rescue boats to represent solutions. It can address issues with communication or interaction, as well as critical thinking, as ultimately the participants might come to the conclusion that part of the statement is not true. It can also develop skills like persuasion, expressing opinions, proposing solutions.
